History Pages of Treverva and Lamanva on Facebook

Have you visited Facebook and seen the pages of history relating to our villages. If not, then you must. There are lots of photos both current and old. Hazel Perham (UTAH) has for many years collated so much information and often in the past has held open days in Treverva village hall to exhibit and discuss this subject. Now it is available to see on Facebook. It is especially good that more people are adding photos to this.

Only fairly recently a lady contacted the Parish Council asking about Lamanva Model Farm and the Lobb family. As young children she and her young brother were evacuated here in the war. She remembers so much about Lamanva and talks of a German Bomber blowing up two Dutch Boats carrying fuel in Falmouth Harbour and then flying over the fields where they were playing at the back of the farm. She said the Lobbs were the first to have a tractor and she remembers cutting the hay. We are hoping she can remember being schooled in the Chapel schoolroom. There is another lady who has been in touch as she too was evacuated to Lamanva and talked about it being a 'magic time'. More to follow on this very interesting subject – but do look at the history pages on Facebook

This leads on quite nicely with the question 'what happens next with the Chapel?' It has been reported in a local paper by Treverva Choir that it is 'For Sale' We are not sure of this but any news will be reported. Watch this space!!!!

TRAFFIC CALMING

In 2013 I met with Neil Hatton, County Councillor, who arranged a meeting with a representative of the Highways Dept to discuss our concern about traffic speeding through Treverva & Lamanva and to seek any calming measures they could offer. In view of current budget constraints, the speed check is the best solution the County Council can provide at this time.
