SPEED WATCH - The Treverva Speed Watch started operating last August after a long campaign to do something about speeding through the village. The Police eventually agreed with local opinion that there was a problem after statistics showed a 10% speeding rate through the village.

For the period Aug – Dec 2016 there were 9 sessions and 30 vehicles were observed to be speeding. Given the sessions are only a small percent of the time it shows that a lot of vehicles do speed through the village. The deterrent effect is noticeable and motorists do reduce speed on seeing the warning signs. Leaflets explaining the operation of Speed Watch are available in the village hall.
