HOW TIMES CHANGE:-

We recently were asked by the Village Hall Committee “how can we celebrate the Queen’s Birthday?”

In 1945 events were taking place in Treverva and Lamanva to celebrate events of that era.

According to the Men’s Institute records Mrs Stella Lobb of Lamanva was asked for a barn to be loaned for a dance with entertainments by the Hayle Merry Makers. At this event £15.15s.0d (£15.75) was raised.

Ms Sam Dunstan of Treverva Farm was asked for the loan of a field for Sports day..... The shop meadow field was used on August 31st 1945. A loud speaker van was booked, programmes and posters printed. Prize money was agreed. K and N Rolling, G Treloar and G Evans took charge of side shows.

The Young Farmers competed in a Sheaf Pitching event and Mr Knowles makes the Sheafs for the event.

The West Briton & Cornish Echo are to be sent details.

Mr Percy Lobb, H G Evans, J Mitchell supply a silver cup costing 55 shillings.

Mr & Mrs Treloar of Helland Mill donate a Rooster for one of the side shows.

15 stewards were chosen from the village.

A football match was arranged between the WI (The Pheasants) and the Treverva Men’s Foortbal Team. The women won as they were allowed to handle the ball and the men could not run.

By 1947 the Treverva Men’s FB team ask to use the Men’s Institute as a dressing room for home matches. 2/6d was agreed for rent and is to be paid to the caretaker Mr G Pellow. He has no responsibility for any loss of property on using the room.
