Budock Parish Neighbourhood Plan Information & Consultation Day

Over eighteen months ago, following an open meeting in Budock Village Hall, a committee was formed of people from all walks of life, full of enthusiasm to preserve the special things about living in Budock Parish. A neighbourhood plan is a statement describing how people would like the neighbourhood area to be at the end of the planning period, preserving and protecting the build and natural heritage.

Parishioners have already completed a questionnaire, telling the committee what are the most important factors about living here. The committee invite everyone to come along to an Information Day, to take place at the Budock Village Hall on **Saturday 9th June from 10 am to 4 pm**. There will be plenty to look at and committee members will be on hand to answer questions and find out what really matters to everyone living in the area. A further information day will take place in Treverva Village hall on a date to be arranged – details to be announced

IMPORTANT: Cornwall Council (CC) has proposed to the Local Boundary Commission for England (LGBCE) that Budock Parish be incorporated within the divisional ward of Falmouth. This has been done without consultation with, or informing, Budock Parish Council or the residents of the Parish. The vast majority of the Parish remain unaware of the proposal. If this goes ahead then the rural community will be disenfranchised as the 'townies' will outnumber the present Parish population so that representative will have an urban view rather than a 'countryside' view.

You can find details of the proposals in the CC's 'Response to the LGBCE – Cornwall LGBC site. Click on top of item that refers to Publication being postponed. Scroll down to and click on 'Submission from division arrangements consultation'. Then click on Cornwall Council. This will lead you to a 140 page document. Page 10 is the first you will find out about item 29 'Falmouth Trescobeeas and Budock!
