Sad News: It is with great sadness to report that Jack (William Edward James) Pascoe - aged 91 of Lamanva (previously Treverva) passed away peacefully in hospital on 18 February. He lived in Treverva, prior to the Argal reservoir being built, and then moved to Lamanva as a young boy. He was well known and loved by many of us. He retired at 65 and during his working life he was a painter and decorator after completing an apprenticeship with Moss Brothers Painters and Decorators and Funeral Directors of Falmouth. He loved his community and had many roles in the villages - Father Christmas for the children, raised money with weekly whist drives, Chairman of the Friendship Club and last and certainly not least attending regularly and maintaining the Methodist Chapel - being the last person to leave the Chapel (which he loved) when it closed.

He was completely lost after his sister, Marion passed away in July 2019.

Community Speed Watch. As there will be no Speed Visor installed in the village, it is intended to continue with the Community Speed Watch.
The last 14 sessions, before lockdown, recorded 57 vehicles exceeding the speed limit by a considerable margin. 54 drivers received warning letters from Devon and Cornwall Police. From the available statistics it is clear that there is a speeding problem through the village. It is better to prevent speeding rather than wait for an accident. We do need volunteers for this.
